Background

- Prevalence of mental health problems among returning Veterans (Iraq and Afghanistan)
 - 1 in 8 suffers from PTSD (AP, 2004)
 - 15-20% of frontline infantry experienced traumatic brain injury (TBI; Hoge et al. 2008)
- The # of returning veterans to Maricopa County is likely to increase dramatically in the next 2 yrs



The Problem

- Links between these issues, substance abuse and other forms of anti-social behavior unknown
- Well-established literature on how mentally ill find themselves in the CJ system
- **The movement to create Veterans Courts**
 - Applying drug court model to special problem of veterans in the CJ system
 - Buffalo (NY) and a handful of others
 - The Maricopa County Exploratory Committee

■ The Veterans Addendum


- Series of questions on military service and servicerelated problems (post-discharge)




Percent of Respondents Who are Veterans (n=617)






Selected Demographics Comparing Veteran and Non-Veteran Arrestees






Most Serious Type of Offense at Arrest






Length of Service (n=43)






Time Since Discharge (n=43)






Physical Injuries, PTSD, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse Problems






Violent Victimization in Past 12 Months






Marijuana Use and Urinalysis by Veteran Status






Powder Cocaine Use and Urinalysis by Veteran Status






Crack Cocaine Use and Urinalysis by Veteran Status

- Many suffering from service-related problems (56%)
