No Mention of Hispanic/Latino Community

But

Not Quite the Same

Public Opinion Polls

Hispanic/Latino Community

- Less trustful than whites
- More trustful than African Americans

Complex Local Politics

■ 1960s: White Power / Black Powerlessness

- Today: Increasing Black Political Power
 - Black mayors, police chiefs, city majorities

- Similar: Latino City Majorities
 - Latino mayors, chiefs,

What's Different

- Immigration

- Then, <u>Community Policing</u>, <u>Problem-Oriented Policing</u>, 1980-
 - Many Successes
